LifeWorks Photo Album software enables you to create slideshows and printable photo album pages. The Photo Album software uses Active Disk Technology.

- A quick setup of Active Disk Technology is required the first time you use the Photo Album software.
- After the setup, the software automatically starts everytime you insert your disk.
- The Photo Album software and images always remain on the Zip® disk.



To setup Photo Album:

- Insert your Photo Album Zip disk and open your Zip disk by double clicking the Zip disk icon in My Computer or in **Windows Explorer** (this window might open automatically).
- Double-click the setup icon (**setup** or **setup.exe**). This installs the Active Disk Technology driver.
- When the installation completes, click **Close**.
- Press the eject button on the Zip drive to eject the disk and then restart your computer (setup is complete).
- To use the program, reinsert your Photo Album disk after Windows finishes loading.
- To save and close Photo Album, eject the disk.

The following are some tasks you can perform with LifeWorks Photo Album software. Click the help button on the top of the Photo Album software window for additional help.

Adding Images to the Photo Album

Each LifeWorks Photo Album disk is a single photo album. When you add an image to your photo album (the LifeWorks Photo Album disk) the album displays a small version (or thumbnail) of that image on the left side of the screen. All the photos in your album display on the left side of the Photo Album window. To add images to your photo album:

1. Click the add images icon on the bottom left of the the Photo Album Window.
2. Click From computer unless you want to add an image directly from a digital camera or scanner. In that case, click From scanner/camera.
3. Select the image you want to add to your photo album and click Ok. (To select multiple images press Ctrl and select the images). If you are adding images from a camera or scanner, the menu for the device displays.
4. The image displays as a thumbnail in the photo album. You can drag the thumbnails to different tabs in your album.

NOTE: You can also drag and drop images from your hard drive (or Windows Explorer) to your photo album disk.

Printing the Photo Album

You can set up one printable layout for each photo album. To print images in a print layout:


1. Click the Print Layout tab.
2. Drag and drop thumbnail images from your photo album onto a print layout page (the white area on the right of the window is the print layout page). You can add multiple images to one print layout page.
3. To print, click the printer icon on the right side of the window.

Creating and Playing a Slideshow

You can create one slideshow for each photo album disk. The slideshow displays images using the entire screen. The slideshow automatically plays every time you insert the disk.

To create a slideshow:

1. Click the Slideshow tab.
2. Drag and drop thumbnail images from the photo album to the slideshow reel on the right side at top of the page (the line of small boxes surrounded by red arrows is the slideshow reel).
3. The slideshow plays the images in the order they appear on the reel. Move images to different locations on the reel by dragging and dropping them in a new square on the reel.
4. Press the silver and black play button on the right side of the window.
